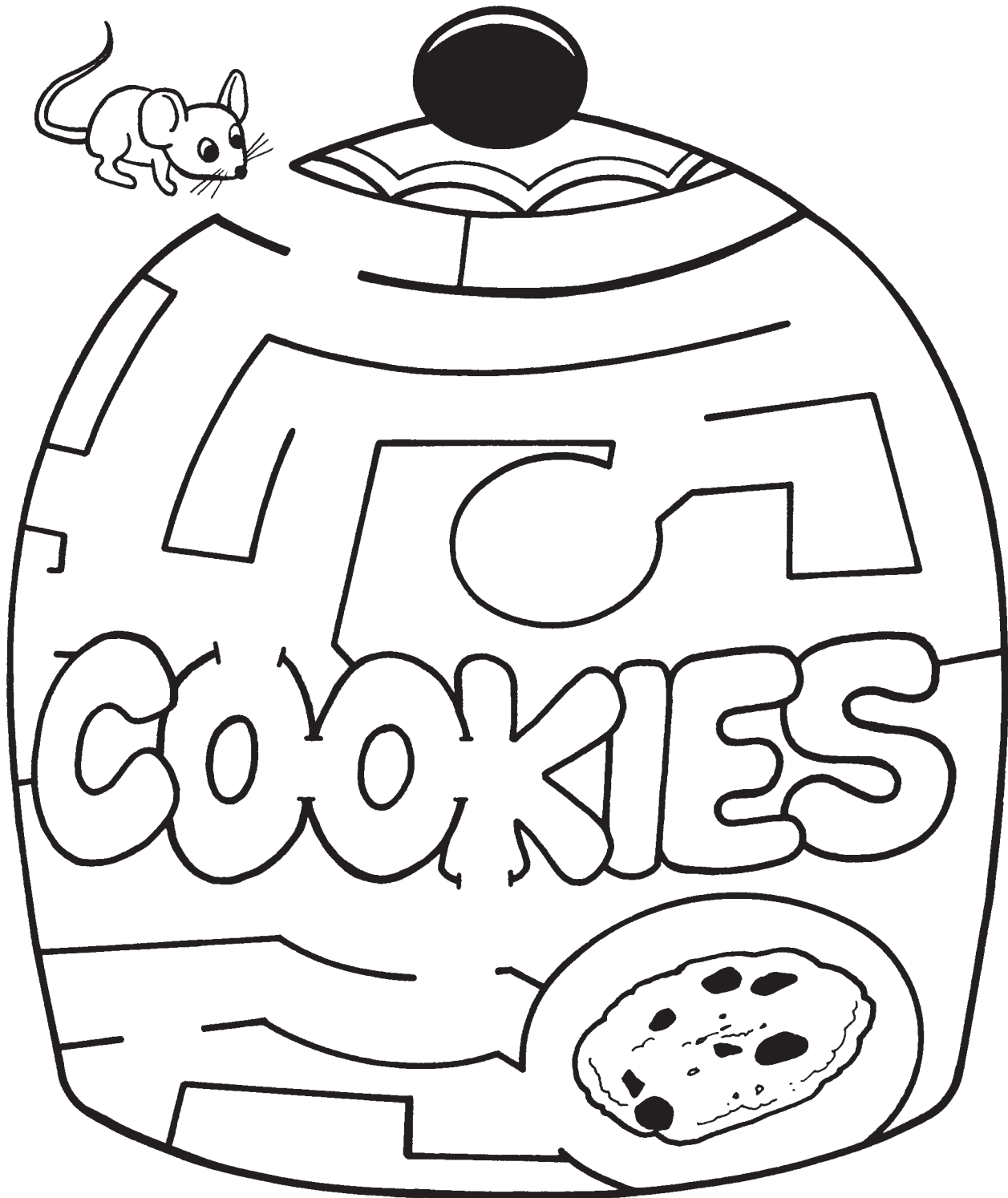

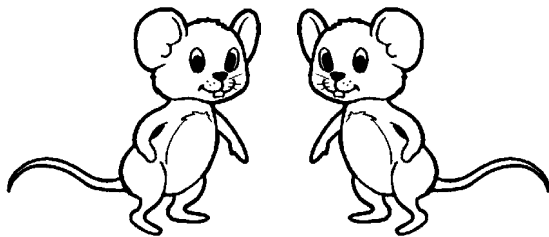


# Mousey Poems and Chants

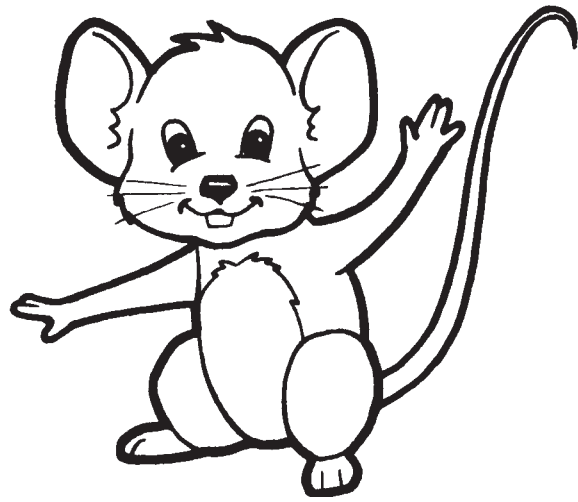
## My Friend, the Mouse
