

Design a Bookmark

These days, book publishers often create bookmarks to help promote a particular book. You can design a bookmark for your favorite book. You'll need a strip of heavy paper (4" x 8"). Include the following information on your bookmark:

- title of the book
- **?** author
- publisher
- price
- **?** a brief description of the book
- a picture of the book's cover
- a quote by you, explaining why people should read this book



Consider punching a hole in the top of your bookmark and threading two pieces of colorful yarn through it, knotting the ends into a tassel.

Once you have completed your bookmark, you may want to laminate it with plastic. Your teacher may be able to do this, or you may take your bookmark to a copy shop for lamination.
