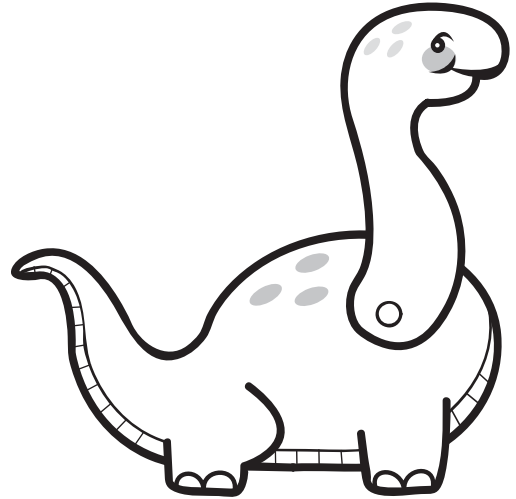

Materials: dinosaur head and body patterns (page 219), brad, construction paper

Preparation: Copy the dinosaur patterns onto construction paper. Cut out the dinosaur.

Directions: Demonstrate how to connect the dinosaur head to the body using a brad. Glue only the body to the page so the head may be moved freely.

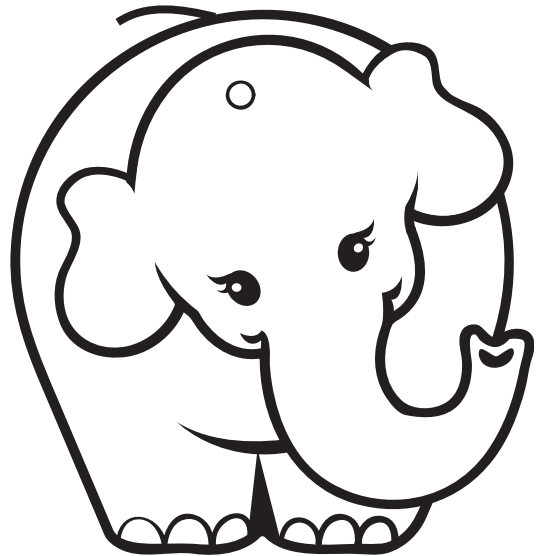


Ee is for elephant

Materials: elephant head and body patterns (page 220), gray or purple construction paper, brad, gray yarn

Preparation: Copy the elephant pattern onto construction paper. Cut out the elephant head. Cut the yarn into 1" pieces. Tie a knot at one end of each length of yarn.

Directions: Cut out the elephant body. Demonstrate how to connect the head to the body using a brad. Glue the elephant body to the page. Glue a piece of yarn to the body for the elephant's tail.



Ff is for fish

Materials: fish pattern (page 221), white construction paper, aluminum foil, *The Rainbow Fish*, leftover pieces of construction paper

Preparation: Copy the fish pattern onto construction paper. Cut out a small fin from aluminum foil. Cut out the fish.

Directions: Create colored stripes and fins using leftover pieces of construction paper. Read aloud the story, *The Rainbow Fish*. Glue the aluminum foil fin to the fish. Glue the fish to the page.
