Introduction

The old adage "practice makes perfect" can really hold true for children and their education. The more practice a child has with concepts taught in school, the more success they are likely to find. Practice Pages (pages 4–39)—There are 36 practice pages organized sequentially so that children can build their knowledge toward higher-level math skills.


Cumulative Review (pages 40–45)—The six practice tests are given in a multiple-choice format designed to prepare students for the standardized tests administered in schools.
